Innova Academy's mission is to empower students to succeed academically, socially, and emotionally by embracing the power of play.

Briefly describe the proposed school model and how this model addresses innovation in education and the proposed community needs.

Innova Academy (INA) is a future school dedicated to reimagining middle and high school education through the power of play. Guided by our core values - Innovation, Integrity, and Inclusion - INA advances equity in education to inspire deeper learning.

At the heart of our approach is what we call the *INA Way*. Our innovation is to transcend traditional educational approaches by redefining how our students learn. Through the integration of three key design elements, Game-Based Learning (GBL), our *Rise and Thrive* character development framework, and our Village community approach, INA creates a cohesive, student-centered experience. Through these design elements, the *INA Way* is a holistic model reflecting our commitment to addressing the diverse needs of our students.

During one of INA's community focus groups last year, a grandmother shared that her deepest hope for public education was for schools to once again serve as true pillars of the community, "...much like the days when a church stood on one corner and a school on the other. Families knew they could turn to either for support." Inspired by this vision, INA aims to be a place where families, community members, and students come together to learn, grow, and thrive.

Through our first design element, Game Based Learning, INA anchors its instructional model in transforming traditional learning into dynamic, learning mission-driven experiences. Our innovation lies in leveraging adolescents' natural curiosity and enthusiasm. We create engaging and inclusive learning experiences to cater to diverse learning styles - an approach transformative for middle school students who are at a critical juncture in their academic and social trajectories. By immersing students in real-life scenarios and transforming learning into an adventure, GBL promotes engagement, collaboration, and problem solving. In turn, we not only enhance academic outcomes but also foster creativity, resilience and teamwork. Learning missions integrate inquiry-based challenges aligned with Indiana Academic Standards, ensuring academic rigor while making learning interactive and accessible for all.

In addition to academic growth, INA prioritizes students' socio-emotional and character development. Through our second design element, our *Rise and Thrive* framework, students cultivate resilience, empathy, and self-awareness. This approach integrates restorative practices and social-emotional learning (SEL) strategies to foster emotional intelligence. The inclusion of *Rise and Thrive* ensures that students develop the character traits to manage emotions effectively, build and sustain healthy relationships, and resolve conflicts constructively. We believe that these are foundational skills needed for strong leadership and lifelong success.

Our third design element, the Village approach, centers collaboration amongst students, families, educators, and community partners to create an inclusive and supportive learning environment. It is rooted in meaningful partnership with families and the broader community, because INA recognizes that no child grows alone. Building true relationships within the community allows INA to extend engagement beyond school. INA's culturally relevant community-based partnerships aligned to students' aspirations and daily lives. These external partners further ensure that we can equip our students with the skills needed to thrive in a collaborative and inclusive community.

In addition, our Family Game Nights bring our GBL model directly to the INA community, inviting families not only to participate, but to play and learn alongside us. Also, through service-learning initiatives, we promote just how important it is for students to apply their learning to solving real issues or problems in their community. Finally, we intentionally cultivate a strong alumni network, creating a lasting home for our graduates, a place where they can return for support, mentorship, and connection.

Through INA's holistic model we set a new standard for middle and high school education by seamlessly integrating academic rigor, character development, and community engagement. Through GBL, *Rise and Thrive*, and the Village approach, INA prepares students to excel academically, grow personally, and contribute in a meaningful way to their communities.
